The Gospel of Christ from Genesis
Sin: There is a Snake in the Garden – Genesis 3:1-7

This is the word of God. Genesis 3:1-7.

1 Now the serpent was more crafty than any other beast of the field that the LORD God had made. He said to the woman, “Did God actually say, ‘You shall not eat of any tree in the garden?’” **2** And the woman said to the serpent, “We may eat of the fruit of the trees in the garden, **3** but God said, ‘You shall not eat of the fruit of the tree that is in the midst of the garden, neither shall you touch it, lest you die.’” **4** But the serpent said to the woman, “You will not surely die. **5** For God knows that when you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil.” **6** So when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was a delight to the eyes, and that the tree was to be desired to make one wise, she took of its fruit and ate, and she also gave some to her husband who was with her, and he ate. **7** Then the eyes of both were opened, and they knew that they were naked. And they sewed fig leaves together and made themselves loincloths.

May God bless this His Word to the heart of His people.

So far in this study on the book of Genesis there has been God, the Holy Spirit and it was learned that everything was made through Christ. Now here in this study is the opportunity to look at a frightening moment, the fall or decent of man into sin. All of sudden someone shows up. Satan comes in the form of a serpent for the work of temptation. Where did he come from? In the text there is Adam and Eve and we already know where they came from. They came from dirt. Adam is formed by the hand of God. God breathes into him the breathe of life and He makes man in His image. Because it was not good for the man to be alone Eve was created. The Lord takes from Adam a rib and fashions a woman. Then He brings the two together and puts them into this covenant marriage which is there to reveal ultimately the relationship one has with Christ. The Groom being Christ and the church is His bride. Now they set about the call, the creation mandate; subdue the earth, be fruitful and multiply and rule over the creation. God has given everything He has created to them to enjoy and use for His glory except they are not to eat of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. For the day that they eat of that tree surely death will come.

Many ask how much time had passed from when Adam and Eve were put in the garden and when Satan came in and they were put out of the garden. It is not known how long of a time this was. Personally I think it was not a very long time. But all of a sudden Satan is there. So where did he come from? There are other passages of Scripture that tell us about him. There are three or four passages that tell us who Satan is, his origin, and why he is doing what he is doing in the garden. The snake is in the garden. Satan is at work in the garden. One of the passages that make reference to Satan is Ezekiel 28. It also tells the reader that Satan was a created angel and it says that he was the angel of all the angels. The passage specifically calls him “anointed guardian cherub” (Ezekiel

28:14) which means he was over all the angels. Using the language of today Satan would have been God's Prime Minister, God's Executive Leader, over all of the hierarchy of angelic hosts. So why is he not in that position today?

Ezekiel tells the reader why but Isaiah 14 also tells why Satan is not in that position today. Isaiah 14:12-15; **12** *"How you are fallen from heaven, O Day Star, son of Dawn! How you are cut down to the ground, you who laid the nations low! 13 You said in your heart, 'I will ascend to heaven; above the stars of God I will set my throne on high; I will sit on the mount of assembly in the far reaches of the north; 14 I will ascend above the heights of the clouds; I will make myself like the Most High.' 15 But you are brought down to Sheol, to the far reaches of the pit."* This angelic being created in glory, for God's glory decides his glory is more important. The key of course are the "I will's" in this passage. It is even starker in the Hebrew language. Notice how the "I will's" unfold in this passage. Then Satan chooses the Hebrew name for the supremacy of God when he says "Most High" in verse 14. Basically Satan is saying here, "I will make myself to the supreme supremacy of God. I will rise up above Him. I will because I want that." But the result is he is cast down. Not only is Satan cast down to the earth where God will use him to show His power and glory but ultimately to Sheol, hell or the pit.

Now the reader sees Satan's first work upon the earth in the garden. Satan goes to the place where God's people have been created for fellowship with the Lord and he invades it. There is much to be learned about Satan here. What else is known about Satan? Paul says in 2 Corinthians 2:11, *"...we are not ignorant of his (Satan's) designs (schemes)."* God's people are not to be ignorant of Satan's schemes or snares.

In my day there was a boxer before me that had an amazing record and athletic ability and then there was another boxer right after him that was still a little bit before me. I always wondered what it would have been like if Rocky Marciano had fought Joe Lewis. Those are two great boxers and unbelievable athletes. Joe Lewis was a real student of his sport and his opponents. A person interviewing him asked him, "How do you not only win but how do you utterly destroy your opponents even before the match almost begins?" Joe Lewis looked at him and said, "Well I know what they are going to do before they know what they're going to do." He would study his opponent so much that he knew what his opponent would do before his opponent even knew he was about to do it. The Bible tells us not to be ignorant of the schemes and snares of Satan. Do not be unawares. One needs to know what Satan does before he does it.

So what does one know about Satan from this text? In this text one has the unfolding of both his schemes and his snares. He has three schemes that are in the text. The first scheme is that Satan always works under disguise. Disguise is the key here. In this text his disguise is a serpent. The serpent is a beast of the field that is cunning. Satan will be forever associated with the serpent from this text even all the way to Revelation 12:9 where it tells the reader of God's ultimate, consummate glory where the devil, the dragon, the serpent of old is cast down and will be thrown in the lake of fire. Disguise is still the way Satan works today. Satan does not come in one's life or against one's life to

ensnare or trap one. He does not come in neon lights flashing “Hi, I’m Satan and I’m here to bring death and destruction to your life and your family.” He does not do that. He comes in disguise.

He has disguises that are multiple and many that are beyond a serpent. The Bible says that he can even appear as an angel of light and will even attempt to invade not only a garden but invade the church in the last days as the One who comes in His name. He will attempt to do signs, wonders and miracles that are false signs, wonders and miracles with great power to even deceive very elect if at all possible. He loves to come in deception through the work of cartoonists and the caricatures. Oh how he loves for people to think of him as the red suit, pointed tale, horned demon holding a pitch fork. He loves for people to think of him as a cartoon character. He loves for people to dismiss him with the comedians of today as a joke. I will be developing this in much more detail in a series called Satan; His Schemes, Snares and his Servants. In this text one sees one of his schemes as a disguise. Satan loves to disguise where he even loves to occupy pulpits. He loves to have the lie preached in the name of religion even nominal Christianity. Satan works by disguise.

The second scheme here is that he works by deception. He says here to Eve “Does God’s Word really say this? Is God really true?” By the way, the deception can easily be given as a bogus offer as Satan gives his word to a person. Satan says, “You will surely not die. Sin won’t bring death. By the way, did you know that you cannot only trust God’s Word but God is trying to restrict you? God’s Word does not bring freedom. God’s Word brings bondage. By the way, it is not knowing God that’s life but in fact you ought to be like God. God is not someone to worship. God is someone to envy. You should try to get His position. God is not a God to trust. God is a God to outsmart. God is not one who is benevolent toward His people. He really has malevolent purposes. In fact don’t look to God but to me. I’ll be your counselor. I’ll be your friend. I’ll help you get above God. You can be like God. Actually you deserve to be like God. I’ll be your life coach. Forget God. Listen to me.”

Satan not only comes with disguise and deception but the third scheme is he comes with distortion. He comes with distortion of God’s Word. Here he even brought Eve into the process of distorting God’s Word. Notice what Satan says to Eve in Genesis 3:1, *He (Satan) said to the woman, “Did God actually say, ‘You shall not eat of any tree in the garden’?”* Now notice what Eve says in Genesis 3:2, 3 where Satan has already got the lure out and Eve is even adding to God’s Word; **2** *And the woman said to the serpent, “We may eat of the fruit of the trees in the garden, 3 but God said, ‘You shall not eat of the fruit of the tree that is in the midst of the garden, neither shall you touch it, lest you die.’”* God did not say they could not touch it. God just told them they could not eat from it. Here Satan has begun his work of deception. He is disguised and he is deceiving. He distorts God’s Word and he distorts God. He distorts man, male and female, to think they can be like God. He distorts himself by saying, “I’m not Satan the adversary, I’m your friend and your counselor. I’m the one that really looks out for you.”

Then there is Adam. Adam has now stumbled. Just a few verses before this passage Adam exercised the leadership in the covenant as he named his wife. In Genesis 2:23, 24 Adam says, *“This at last is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh; she shall be called Woman, because she was taken out of Man.” Therefore a man shall leave his father and his mother and hold fast to his wife, and they shall become one flesh.* Here is this wonderful moment of leadership with Adam and there is Eve, the one who compliments him and comes along side of him, and now they are both abandoning their responsibilities. Eve no longer compliments Adam she now starts to lead him. Adam no longer leads his wife. Adam submits to the voice of his wife who has submitted to the voice of the serpent. The word of the serpent came to the woman and the woman heard. The word of the woman came to the man and the man heard. It is so clear here.

What had Adam been doing previously? He had been naming the animals. To name something means to show authority and define it. When Adam was naming the animals he was looking for a helpmate. I always thought that Adam was off doing something else while Eve was with the serpent but according to Genesis 3:6 Adam was with Eve the whole time. *“So when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was a delight to the eyes, and that the tree was to be desired to make one wise, she took of its fruit and ate, and **she also gave some to her husband who was with her, and he ate.**”* Would not one think a spiritual leader at this point would step up and point out the things that have gone wrong here? As a spiritual leader Adam should have said something like this; “Honey, I just named the animals and I didn’t find any snakes that were talking. There’s something missing here. By the way honey, this thing that you are quoting God, you’re not getting His Word right. That is not what He said. This notion that we will surely die and that on the contrary we can be like God in life and death? Honey that is not the God I’ve known and have been serving. That is not the God that made us.” No, Adam did not say something like that yet Adam is like a lot of other men. “Honey what ever you want. I just want a little peace here in the house. I don’t care. You just do what you want to do.” Then Adam abdicates his responsibility of leadership. Eve abdicates her call to be a compliment and she then begins to lead him. Adam then listens to the voice of his wife.

Where does that lead? It leads one to Genesis 3:7 which is shame, guilt, brokenness. The pristine beauty of God’s creation for His glory and the special creation of man, male and female, made in His image is now marred and polluted because of sin. This is the descent into sin. What can a person learn from this?

Here are two practical takeaways that a one can learn from this passage. This first one applies to every one who is a Christian, who has acknowledged and put their trust in Jesus as their personal Lord and Savior and who has determined that they cannot save themselves and need a Savior. Here is a reminder to Christians. Satan not only has his schemes but he has his snares. Those snares are something he always uses.

The snares of Satan are found in 1 John 2. John’s words are ones that deal with a practical Christian life. 1 John 2:15-17; **15 Do not love the world or the things in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him.**

16 For all that is in the world—the **desires of the flesh and the desires of the eyes and pride in possessions**—is not from the Father but is from the world. **17** And the world is passing away along with its desires, but whoever does the will of God abides forever. The world's system of rebellion against God is the desires of the flesh, the desires of the eyes, and the pride in possessions. The idolatry of self is fueled by the idolatry of gratification (the flesh), the desires of control (the eyes) and the glory (pride) of one's life. This kind of person eats and drinks to the glory of themselves. There is a progression here. There are the appetites of hunger and thirst, then the appetites of knowledge, then the appetites of significance and sex. This kind of person says, "I deserve for those appetites to be fulfilled." Then comes the menu that is displayed here which is the desire of the eyes where one looks at all these things and they get captured by them. This person says, "It is all about me. It's the pride of my life." 1 John describes the way Satan begins to work; the desire of the flesh where the appetites must rule in life. Then comes the desire of the eyes where Satan says, "I'll show you the things that will fill these appetites." Then comes the boastful pride of life where Satan says, "It's really about you. It is really about self-fulfillment, self-gratification and self-reliance. It is really about what I said it was about, 'I will ascend. I will raise up myself.'"

So is that what happened in the garden? Did Satan use his snares? Genesis 3:6, "So when **the woman saw that the tree was good for food** (lust of the flesh), and that **it was a delight to the eyes** (lust of the eyes), and that **the tree was to be desired to make one wise** (she could be like God – the boastful pride of life), she took of its fruit and ate, and she also gave some to her husband who was with her, and he ate." All three of Satan's snares are used here in the garden. That is the anatomy of sin. This is the way Satan works in each of our lives. So today to the Christian who knows they are not sinless, but because of Christ wants to sin less. One who has Jesus on the throne of their life is not lazy about the sin in their life. They hate the sin in their life and want to sin less. This text holds the key for the one who wants their life growing in God's grace saying "yes" to God and "no" to sin and the glory of self.

James 1 is almost like the antidote to Genesis 3. It is like James is giving the reader the call to counteract everything one finds there. James says some powerful things about the practical life. James 1:12-15; **12 Blessed is the man who remains steadfast under trial, for when he has stood the test he will receive the crown of life, which God has promised to those who love him. 13 Let no one say when he is tempted, "I am being tempted by God," for God cannot be tempted with evil, and he himself tempts no one. 14 But each person is tempted when he is lured and enticed by his own desire. 15 Then desire when it has conceived gives birth to sin, and sin when it is fully grown brings forth death.** This text is saying that the believer desires to be steadfast, to grow in grace and to say "no" to sin.

Now, here is a look at the anatomy of sin. First one is lured and that is temptation. It is known from this passage in James that God tempts no one to evil. God is not tempted and God does not tempt. So when one is tempted it is from Satan and his servants. The allurements are there and when it is joined with

one's desire it gives birth to sin. In other words when the "old man" comes out because of the desire to glorify self and it marries temptation then the child is sin and the result of sin is death. The best way not to have the child of sin is to get rid of the parents. If the child is sin who are the parents? The parents are temptation married to the glory of self meaning "it is all about me." That is when sin comes.

Sin in the Genesis text was not the tree. In fact all the evidence is clear. The tree is good. Everything God made He said was good. Sin is not the thing. The things in this world are amoral. Sin is the transgression of God's Word. Sin is to say, "God I don't believe You. I don't believe Your Word therefore I will live in contradiction to that Word. I will transgress that Word. I will live not for the glory of God I will live for the glory of self."

So how does a Christian get rid of sin in their life? Remember one is not getting rid of sin to get to heaven but one is trusting in Jesus Christ alone to get to heaven. It is His righteousness that is the believer's righteousness. It is His blood that cleanses the believer from all of their sin but because one is a Christian one wants to deal with sin in their life. The Christian hates sin in their life and the best way for them not to have it is to get rid of the parents.

So how does one get rid of temptation? There are two ways. The first way is to pray the way Jesus taught the believer to pray. Matthew 6:9-13, "*Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name. Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors. And **lead us not into temptation**, but deliver us from evil.*" The positive is "Lord, lead me into righteousness." In other words, pray that God would fill one's life with the love of Christ. The second way to get rid of temptation is to flee it. It seems there are so many things Christians get backwards in their Christian life. Here is one. A Christian will exalt themselves and then pray for humility. God says, "Humble yourself and I will exalt you at the right time" (James 4:10). Here is another one the Christian gets backwards. The Christian will flee Satan and try to resist temptation. The Bible says in James 4:7, "*Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you.*" Why? It is because Jesus defeated Satan at the cross and greater is He that is in you than he that is in the world. Do not flee Satan, resist him. God does not allow the believer to flee Satan because He has called the believer to the battle. Resist Satan and he will flee from you and flee temptation.

When I became a believer I came out of an immoral and ungodly life. I noticed my summers were difficult for me as a new Christian. I began to wonder why. A friend of mine who was also a Christian came along and said, "Harry are you having a hard time in summer lately?" I said, "Yeah." He said, "Remember back before we were Christians, when were the times that we were unleashed in our immorality, our ungodliness and our rebellion against God in those years?" I said, "That's easy, OD." That did not mean overdose, it meant Ocean Drive which is next to Myrtle Beach. I realized that in the summers I would go back to Myrtle Beach and that is where I would engage in ungodly behavior. Then I said, "You know what? I don't think I need to go there anymore." So for five years I

never went back to the beach. The tree of the knowledge of good and evil was not the sin it was disobedience to God. So the beach is not evil. It was what I was doing when I was there that was wrong. The smells, the sounds, the places and the relationships I had at the beach reminded me of the things I did as a non Christian. When I went back as a believer it began to take hold of me. So for five years I had to flee temptation until God put other things in my life that were deeper and stronger. Do not go and try to resist it but flee it.

Maybe there is one reading this that needs to flee a computer that is in a room where the door can close because of what one might be drawn to or will go to and one cannot stop hitting that clicker. Maybe you are like the young man I pastored in Chattanooga, Tennessee whose family kept breaking up because of his immorality. He would repent and confess and his wife was gracious to take him back. After this cycle, one time I took him to lunch. I will call him Joe at this point. I said to him, "Joe we have got to break this thing. Where do you work?" He told me. Then I had enough sense to ask him, "Joe where do you park when you go to work?" He told me. I said, "Joe if you park there then you must pass the three blocks that say "Adult Bookstores" across the storefront?" (Thankfully they are no longer there today). He said, "I sure do." He would go right by these stores and he would get caught. I said, "Let me guess, you resolve and you go by it and you resist, right? Then the next week you stop and look in the window and the next week you go in." Then the next week he would buy something from them. The next week his faithfulness to his wife even under his resolve would begin to crumble. The lust of the flesh, the lust of the eyes, the boastful pride of life were all there. He would then begin to rationalize and say, "I'll come back after I do this. I deserve this. I'm tired. I work hard. I deserve this." I said, "Joe would you do me a favor? Here is another parking deck. So instead of walking three blocks you are going to have to walk five blocks but you don't have to walk by the bookstores." He agreed. Joe's family today is growing in the grace and knowledge of Christ. Flee temptation.

Now, get rid of self glory by dying to oneself. Say, "I want God's glory." Galatians 2:20, "*The life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me.*" One says, "I die to myself." One may say at this point, "Harry I have already been converted, I've died to myself and committed myself to Christ." That is alright. Every day one has to get up and put the "old man" to death. The "old man" tells us everyday "It is really all about you. You really deserve this today." When Satan comes with his temptations he has got two allies. He has got a whole culture that keeps telling a person, "you deserve a break today. You deserve this. By the way if you buy our thing and eat it you will really have life. Just possess this. This is life. It is all about you." This is the glory of God set aside and exchanged for the glory of self. Satan's temptations are strong. Flee them. Satan is wily but the crucial thing, the inevitability of sin is whenever one exchanges the glory of God for the glory of self. That is what Eve did. Eve thought, "I can be like God. My joy is not to glorify God. I can be like Him." Then she became susceptible. Kill the "old man" daily.

Here is one more takeaway. The statement “kill the ‘old man’ daily” could come from any religious, moralistic comment if it is not anchored in the right place. However this needs to be anchored. So where is Jesus in this? By a man, Adam comes death. By a man, a second Adam comes life, Jesus Christ. When Satan comes after Adam he comes after him with his schemes and his snares but does one think that Satan left Jesus, the second Adam, alone? No, he came after Him too. Luke 4 gives the Christian their victory. I want to enter into the battle against sin. I want to say “no” to myself and I want to flee temptation. I want to do those things but Luke 4 shows us the victory.

*Luke 4:1-12, **1** And Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit in the wilderness **2** for forty days, being tempted by the devil. And he ate nothing during those days. And when they were ended, he was hungry. **3** The devil said to him, “If you are the Son of God, command this stone to become bread.” **4** And Jesus answered him, “It is written, ‘Man shall not live by bread alone.’” **5** And the devil took him up and showed him all the kingdoms of the world in a moment of time, **6** and said to him, “To you I will give all this authority and their glory, for it has been delivered to me, and I give it to whom I will. **7** If you, then, will worship me, it will all be yours.” **8** And Jesus answered him, “It is written, “You shall worship the Lord your God, and him only shall you serve.” **9** And he took him to Jerusalem and set him on the pinnacle of the temple and said to him, “If you are the Son of God, throw yourself down from here, **10** for it is written, “He will command his angels concerning you, to guard you,’ **11** and “On their hands they will bear you up, lest you strike your foot against a stone.” **12** And Jesus answered him, “It is said, ‘You shall not put the Lord your God to the test.’” **13** And when the devil had ended every temptation, he departed from him until an opportune time.*

The first Adam is in a garden with everything he needs, full and fed, and he falls into sin. But God is gracious and He sends a second Adam, Jesus Christ. Jesus Christ comes into this world and Satan comes to Him. Notice how Satan uses the same deceptions. Satan does not have these dominions to give to Jesus. Those kingdoms he showed Jesus are a mist that are about to be blown away. Those are sandcastles in the sky. Yet Jesus is not in a garden He is in a wilderness. He is not fed. He has fasted forty days. Satan comes to Jesus and says, “Jesus isn’t this yours anyway.” Satan comes to Him with the lust of the flesh, “Are you hungry Jesus? Make these stones become bread.” Jesus says, “No, the Word of God says...” Unlike Eve who got it wrong, Jesus gets it right. “The Word of God says, ‘man shall not live by bread alone but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God.’” Satan then says, “Jesus I’ll give you all these kingdoms if you just bow down and worship me.” Jesus does not even correct him because the kingdoms are not Satan’s to give so this was a bogus offer. He simply corrects him by saying, “This is about glory. You shall worship the Lord your God and Him alone.” God’s glory rescued Him in that moment not the glory of self.

Satan is not through yet. He is thinking, “If I can’t get you with the lust of the flesh through hunger or the lust of the eyes through what I can give you then maybe I can’t get you with the boastful pride of life. Okay you want to quote the

Bible? The Bible says in the book of Psalms, that if you're the Son of God you can throw yourself down and not let Your foot be bruised. So throw yourself down and prove who You are." Jesus does not allow the distortion of God's Word. Jesus says, "You shall not tempt the Lord Your God." Satan departs from Him. There is one's victory!

The victory is not one saying, "I'm going to live such a good life that I know you'll love me and I'll just get to heaven." A person's victory is in Jesus Christ. He on this day entered into single combat with Satan to fulfill the will of God, for the glory of God to redeem sinners. Satan comes and says, "hey I have another plan. Jesus, why don't we skip the suffering, the cross, the atonement, the mockery, the rejection and I'll give it all to you. Let's make it all about you." Right then Jesus says, "No, it is not about Me. It is about the glory of My Father. It is written of Me, 'I delight to do Your will, O God.' It is about the salvation of the people whom I have entered into covenant with for the Father." Therefore Jesus did not take the shortcut for the glory of self. He embraced the call of His Father. So one man comes death and by this Man comes the resurrection of the dead.

So this day, who do you believe? Do you believe the promises of God and His Word or will you believe the bogus offers of Satan that sin brings life, that disobedience brings life, that God cannot be trusted? Will you trust God's Word today when He tells you that you cannot save yourself but in Jesus Christ you shall surely be saved? Satan displayed to Him the kingdoms of this world and we sell out for a lot less than that. Give yourself today to Jesus Christ and trust in Him. Christ went and dealt with that temptation through the power of the Spirit and the Word of God which one needs but you must be in Christ and Christ in you.

When I moved to Miami, Florida I did not know anybody so I went to the funeral home. One may say, "Harry you're not going to meet many at the funeral home are you?" I told the funeral director that if anyone showed up and did not have a preacher and needed someone to do the funeral to have them call me. What an opportunity to share the gospel, meet people and minister to people. The funeral director and I began to talk more and he said to me, "Harry in a non-religious or secular funeral do you know what the number one request is for the song played at the funeral?" To give one a clue this was in 1980. He went on to say, "By far this song is almost always asked to be played. It is "I Did It My Way."" What a bogus. I want you to know Jesus Christ. He won the victory. He has defeated Satan, hell and sin. In Him is life and when you know Him I want you to hate sin. Flee temptation and die to yourself every day because the key is when the glory of self begins to take over instead of the glory of God. But on this very day you come to Jesus Christ. He is the One who has entered into that combat. He took no shortcut. He did the suffering. He went to the cross. There is victory in Jesus.

Prayer:

Father, thank you for the moments together in Your Word. O God speak to our hearts. "I Did It My Way" what a dirge of death but to know Jesus all the way what a life! Will You fill our hearts with the love of Christ and the joy of Christ?

Would You give us a heart that looks to Christ and trusts the Word of God?
Would You give us the ability in Christ to grow in and for Him? Now Father we
will give You the praise and the glory because such life is from You. There is no
one else. We would not seek to rise above You but how we thank You that we
can be in Christ and Christ in us. Now Father give us the joy of our Savior and
