I try to include men I am discipling to join me in evangelism and Gospel Appointments.

- I currently am reading through a community bible reading plan that goes through the New Testament every year, and the Old Testament every three years.
- I have a stack of prayer cards that I consistently pray through (sin struggles/growth areas, family, friends, lost, work, goals, nations)
- I am in a discipleship group at our church with one of the pastors and a few other leaders within the church.

THEOLOGICAL INFORMATION

Before becoming a Christian, I lived a life of legalism, addicted to following "the rules" and trying to pay for my own sin. On the outside, I appeared to "have it all together" and was extremely judgmental towards others who did not meet my standards. On the inside, all I felt was guilt as I constantly saw my own sin, but had no way of dealing with it. Much of the time, I felt depressed and punished myself in hopes that God would forgive me. I prayed for forgiveness over and over again, but did not grasp what Jesus accomplished on the cross.

During my freshman year at Berry College, God used Campus Outreach staff and student leaders to free me from my guilt and shame. I was pursued and cared for as they began sharing the beauty of the Gospel, that Christ's death and resurrection could free me from the prison of guilt that I lived in. I will never forget having Hebrews 8:12 explained to me...that through Christ, God not only forgives me of my sin, but also "remembers it no more". After these truths permeated my heart, I had a strong desire to live in the freedom found in the Gospel and point others to that same freedom.
