And, Kathy wanted us to have fun in the process!

My first meeting with Kathy Cheely was in the hallway near my office after one of my first Sundays at Briarwood. She stopped me and introduced herself and shared that she was the first person to serve in the Women's Ministry Coordinator/Director role at Briarwood. She wanted to encourage me in my new role and she wanted me to make sure I included as many women in the ministry as possible. She talked about the importance of friendliness and a welcoming heart. She then reminded me that it was important to wear my name tag because there might be someone new who would not know who I am. Then she promised to be a supporter and cheerleader for me in my new role. She made good on that promise!

Sunday, June 25, 2023 there was a beautiful Celebration of Life service for Kathy who went home on May 13, 2023. As we were led in worship by her grandchildren and as her family shared beautifully of a life well-lived in service to the Lord, I looked around the sanctuary at the many lives who were touched by a woman whose heart was first for the Lord and then for the others. What an impact for the Glory of God! Well-done Kathy Cheely!

Reflections on the life and ministry of Kathy Cheely



Kathy was a woman who loved the Lord and people. To my knowledge she was the first Briarwood Women's Coordinator, and brought to the position boundless energy and enthusiasm. She had an amazing knowledge of scripture and was a great teacher.

She loved getting women together, not only to study the Bible, but also just to have fun and enjoy one another.

She would organize and conduct Christmas parties for all the women who worked at the church, often at her home. She would also occasionally ask the people sitting around her in church to go home with her and Tom to have lunch with them.

Also during her time as coordinator, she organized and held Women's Prayer Retreats at Schocco Springs. Briarwood would pair with ladies from African--American churches in the area for a weekend of prayer and Bible study. It began on Friday afternoon and ended at noon on Sunday. One year there came a tornado late on Saturday night, cutting off power, knocking down trees and blocking the road. With help from the Lord, Kathy and a group of Baptist men clearing the road, we were able to finish the retreat just as we had planned.

Kathy also organized the women to submit their favorite recipes and the Briarwood Cookbook was printed and published. Many of us are still using and enjoying that cookbook.

Kathy set a good example for future coordinators to follow.

Memories of Kathy Cheely

All of us loved Kathy Cheely, or at least I did. I remember when the Cheelys first came to Briarwood. I was teaching kindergarten in the old Briarwood which is now Mountain Brook Community, when they all came in the back door. There was Kathy leading the line with the children behind. There was Andy, Becky, and Anna bringing up the rear. That's the picture that comes to mind when I purposefully think of Kathy. She was in the place she usually occupied, at the head of the line.

Another fond memory is of how Kathy loved to entertain with food and games. When we went to the Cheelys, we were sure to be fed well and we would laugh as we played games. Once she invited all the people on our pew and those on the pew in front and in back to Sunday lunch so we could all get to know each other in that setting. She encouraged us all to follow suit.

Her close friend Glenda Wood told me Kathy "HATED" the movie <u>Princess Bride</u>. That must be because not knowing what she had gotten herself into, she went to see it at The Pitcher Show, a bar/theater, and was very uncomfortable.

Kathy was our first Women's Ministry coordinator. She had a heart for ministry, and attending to the various needs of her flock took precedence over procedures. I loved that about Kathy. Also, she sang and taught at General Assembly every year. As the wife of our Missions Pastor, she was committed to praying for the missionaries and especially those involved in Campus Outreach.

Before Kathy's rapid decline my mentor, Sally Scott, and I went to see her. She was beyond thrilled that we came to minister, and joined in when we prayed. I'm grateful for that time before she wasn't the Kathy I remember, the strong, determined, opinionated, exhorter who loved to feed her flock, but who hated the <u>Princess Bride</u>.






