## Sparkle in the Dark

Winking at us in the dark of night -- each year seemingly earlier than the year before -- we are surprised by the first lights of Christmas. Twinkling Christmas trees peek from windows. Large, illuminated bulbs race along pointed rooftops. Glowing stars dangle above porches. Monstrously over -sized lighted snowflakes cling to city posts. Tiny white lights glimmer in spindly trees. Fairy lights twine around wreaths and garlands and railings and tabletop decorations. Eagerly our eyes search the night for the next shimmering bulb lighting the way toward Christmas. We long for sparkle amid the darkness. More and more and more!

For all of time, we have been seeking to capture and to perfect the use of light -- firelight, oil lamps, candlelight, gas lighting, electric lighting, fluorescent lighting, LED lighting, medical lasers, solar power...... and yet...still...we are not satisfied. Driven by desire for light—bigger, better, brighter, more beautiful – for what are we truly striving? Certainly, light is essential for mankind's physical and emotional well-being. Light produces vitamin D assisting in the absorption of calcium and phosphorus. Light optimizes crop growth for our physical nourishment. Sunlight helps to counteract seasonal affective disorders. For innumerable years, sunlight, moonlight, and the light of stars have served as a guide to mark time and direction. Without hesitation, we declare -- light is vital to mankind. We look for light. We long for light. We yearn desperately for light. But why? What are we truly seeking?

Ponder. Or cogitate as Papa would say. Light was the very first substance that God created (Genesis 1:3) and light has served as a witness of God's presence with mankind ever since. From a burning bush, God spoke to Moses (Exodus 3:2). By night, a pillar of fire led the Israelites out of Egypt (Exodus 13:21). In the velvety black sky, constellations, shooting stars, the Northern Lights ... all declare the glory of God (Psalm 19:1). Beneath the light of a magnificent star, magi were led to Bethlehem to humbly worship Immanuel, God with us (Matthew 2:9). Jesus declares Himself the light of the world (John 8:12). And, at the end of time, the nearness of the Lord alone will be our source of light (Revelation 21:23 and 22:5). Light ... God's presence ... the first and the last, the beginning and the end (Revelation 22:13).

And in between? Our souls hunger for The Light. As the lights of Christmas sparkle in the dark of night...in the darkness of pain...in the darkness of doubt...in the darkness of sin...what light will you seek? What light will you follow? May Jesus, the true Light of Christmas, be your guide.

Then Jesus again spoke to them, saying,
"I am the Light of the world; he who follows Me will not walk in the darkness,
but will have the Light of life."




