
A Woman's Wisdom: How the Book of Proverbs Speaks to Everything

The Book of John

William Hendrickson in his 500 page commentary on the Gospel of John begins with, "The Gospel according to John is the most amazing book that was ever written." This book will strengthen your faith and encourage your heart as you learn more about our wonderful Savior Jesus Christ and how HE has sacrificed everything for you and for me. This will be an 8 week study of the book of John which will require homework and discussion in class.

FOUNDATIONS

This Fall I have asked Cathe Cleveland to share with us about four non-negotiables for us as believers. These are four bedrock truths that our women's ministry will continue to reinforce throughout the Fall and into the new year. I pray you will be both encouraged and challenged as you consider these truths.

How many times did you hear Pastor Reeder remind us that we are to be constantly "on message — on mission — in ministry?" During my years of involvement in women's ministry I learned our Covenant Theology leads us to four non-negotiable truths. These principles should be the basis for all of life and any ministry undertaking. They are non-negotiable essentials. When we adhere to them, we can have confidence we are staying on message as we are on mission, in ministry. Over the next four months we will look at each one in a little more depth.

Here are all four:

God is our reference point. His Word is our authority. His glory is our purpose. His presence is His promise.

God is Our Reference Point

Gerry Largay and her friend Jane Lee set off in April of 2013 to fulfill a life dream of hiking the Appalachian Trail. They had meticulously planned their trip and arranged meeting places with Gerry's husband every few days to be resupplied. When her friend had to return home because of a family emergency, Gerry decided to continue on her own. However, on a trek off the trail for a bathroom stop, she became disoriented and could not find her way back. When she didn't show up the next day for a planned meeting with her husband, searchers were sent out, but no trace was found. Two years passed before a surveyor stumbled on a collapsed tent with her skeletal remains inside.

She had placed her cellphone and journal in a waterproof bag with a note informing whoever found it to return them to her family so they would know the story of her final days. She had journaled for nineteen days after becoming lost. She did not know that a dog team had passed within 100 yards of her, that her campsite was only half a mile from the trail as the crow flies, or that if she had walked downhill, she would have soon reached an old railroad track that would have taken her, in either direction, straight out of the woods. She had sadly lost her sense of direction and had no frame of reference for finding the trail.

We use all kinds of things as points of reference when trying to find our way in life. But all of them have limitations because everything in the created universe is changing. There is only one true reference point that never changes. Before there was anything else, there was God. The first four words of the bible are the same in most if not all English versions. "In the beginning, God " (CONTINUED ON NEXT PAGE)

Apart from Him nothing in our world would even exist. He is over everything, and myriad books have been written trying to describe His greatness to our finite minds. We could spend years searching for words to adequately describe Him and still fall far short. As the only unchanging being in a universe of change, He is distinguished from every created thing. Whatever situation we could possibly find ourselves in, God is our reference point.

Scripture gives us glimpses in many places of how we might comprehend the uniqueness of God. Isaiah uses comparisons of God to familiar images and ideas to illustrate how far He is beyond anything we know. Isaiah 40:12-14 says,

"Who has measured the waters in the hollow of his hand and marked off the heavens with a span, enclosed the dust of the earth in a measure and weighed the mountains in scales and the hills in a balance? Who has measured the Spirit of the LORD, or what man shows him his counsel? Whom did he consult, and who made him understand? Who taught him the path of justice, and taught him knowledge, and showed him the way of understanding?"

This great Creator brought you into this world for His purposes and He is the only point of reference we can confidently return to in any circumstance to reset our bearings and determine what should be done next.

For whatever reason, we tend to look to so many things other than God as our reference point when we face decisions. Since 2001, when I began serving our denomination as a Women's Ministry Trainer, I have had the privilege of sitting under training sessions led by several different trainers. It was one of those trainers that God used to point out my go to error as to my reference point. The trainer emphasized in several different ways the idea that in ministry, a leader needs to remember that "it's not about me".

My awkward middle school years included a transition from private to public school. I made it through by focusing on academic achievements. My go to in problem solving has probably always been my ability to "figure things out". But it doesn't take a comprehensive examination to realize there are limits to my own abilities that will always leave me wanting.

That trainer made obvious for me an issue that has ever since been a constant battle. Applying that truth allows me to intentionally turn to God as my reference point. However, it is very often three steps forward and two steps back. C.S. Lewis describes my tendency this way in *The Problem of Pain*, "They wanted to be nouns, but they were, and eternally must be, mere adjectives." There is a sense where I need to acknowledge He is the subject of every sentence of my life (and ministry), and amazingly, He calls me to the privilege of being a part of the story as a mere adjective, or as an adverb for His actions.

Of course, there are many other things besides self that we use as our reference point rather than God. The danger is we may not realize the inadequacy of our point of reference until we find ourselves in a perplexing dire situation like the one Gerry Largay found herself with no point of reference to find our way out. But when we intentionally look to God as our reference point, He leads us out of even the most bewildering wilderness.





Vientoring Opportunities

Mentoring, Life on Life Relationships, and Discipleship are all terms that seem to be interchangeable in the Christian world. However, we each come to these terms with very different ideas and expectations. For Briarwood Women's Ministry we are moving towards providing opportunity for engagement in these three areas. Below are the definitions we will use to identify the distinctions and expectations for each:

Mentoring. Pairing based around a book study of a focused topic. There is an expectation that the mentor would influence, provide guidance and direction to the mentee as subjects come up in a book study or through conversation. The relationship is once a week for a one semester commitment of time.



Life on Life Relationships. This is an informal introduction to a relationship with someone of another generation. It is built around coffee or lunch, hobbies or shared interests. The pair commits to meet on a regular basis every other week for 5 to 6 months. The hope is that gospel-centered conversations will naturally occur through a growing friendship.

Discipleship. The disciple is committed to entering into a relationship with a discipler who will help them grow in their spiritual disciplines through weekly meetings with homework and focused discussions related to spiritual growth and vitality. The commitment is <u>one semester</u> at a time.


