Judges 4: The Narrative

The Cycle: Sin, Servitude, Supplication

¹And the people of Israel again did what was evil in the sight of the Lord after Ehud died. ² And the Lord sold them into the hand of Jabin king of Canaan, who reigned in Hazor. The commander of his army was Sisera, who lived in Harosheth-hagoyim. ³ Then the people of Israel cried out to the Lord for help, for he had 900 chariots of iron and he oppressed the people of Israel cruelly for twenty years.

Deborah: faithful to her roles and giftings

⁴ Now Deborah, a **prophetess**, the **wife** of Lappidoth, was **judging** Israel at that time. ⁵ She used to sit under the palm of Deborah between Ramah and Bethel in the hill country of Ephraim, and **the people of Israel came up to her for judgment**.

The Word of the Lord to Barak through Deborah

⁶ She sent and summoned Barak the son of Abinoam from Kedesh-naphtali and said to him, "Has not the Lord, the God of Israel, commanded you, 'Go, gather your men at Mount Tabor, taking 10,000 from the people of Naphtali and the people of Zebulun. ⁷ And I will draw out Sisera, the general of Jabin's army, to meet you by the river Kishon with his chariots and his troops, and I will give him into your hand'?"

Barak's fear and lack of faith

⁸ Barak said to her, "If you will go with me, I will go, but if you will not go with me, I will not go."

Deborah's rebuke and support

⁹ And she said, "I will surely go with you. Nevertheless, the road on which you are going will not lead to your glory, for the Lord will sell Sisera into the hand of a woman." Then Deborah arose and went with Barak to Kedesh. ¹⁰ And Barak called out Zebulun and Naphtali to Kedesh. And 10,000 men went up at his heels, and Deborah went up with him.

Just so happens...the Lord coordinates the details

¹¹ Now Heber the Kenite had separated from the Kenites, the descendants of Hobab the father-in-law of Moses, and had pitched his tent as far away as the oak in Zaanannim, which is near Kedesh.

The Victory in Battle (12-16)

¹⁴ And Deborah said to Barak, "Up! For this is the day in which **the Lord has given Sisera into your hand**. Does not the Lord go out before you?" So Barak went down from Mount Tabor with 10,000 men following him. ¹⁵ And **the Lord routed Sisera** and all his chariots and all his army before Barak by the edge of the sword. And Sisera got down from his chariot and fled away on foot.

Just so happens...fulfilled in the Lord's use of Jael (17-22)

¹⁷ But Sisera fled away on foot to the tent of Jael, the wife of Heber the Kenite, for there was peace between Jabin the king of Hazor and the house of Heber the Kenite.

God's sovereignty and the use of His people for His purposes

²³ So on that day **God subdued Jabin** the king of Canaan before the people of Israel. ²⁴ And the hand of the **people of Israel pressed harder** and harder against Jabin the king of Canaan, until they destroyed Jabin king of Canaan.

Judges 5: The Song of Praise

Praising the leaders and people of Israel

²That the leaders took the lead in Israel, that the people offered themselves willingly, bless the Lord!

⁹My heart goes out to the commanders of Israel who offered themselves willingly among the people.

Bless the Lord.

Also verses 13-15, 18: Praise to the tribes of Ephraim, Benjamin, Machir, Zebulun, Issachar, Naphtali

Rebuke of the nations who did not fight

¹⁵Among the clans of Reuben there were great searchings of heart.

Why did you sit still among the sheepfolds, to hear the whistling for the flocks?

Among the clans of Reuben

there were great searchings of heart.

Gilead stayed beyond the Jordan;
 and Dan, why did he stay with the ships?
 Asher sat still at the coast of the sea,
 staying by his landings.

The Lord's victory

⁴Lord, when you went out from Seir, when you marched from the region of Edom, the earth trembled and the heavens dropped, yes, the clouds dropped water.

⁵The mountains quaked before the Lord, even Sinai before the Lord, the God of Israel.

²⁰From heaven the stars fought, from their courses they fought against Sisera.

²¹ The torrent Kishon swept them away, the ancient torrent, the torrent Kishon. March on, my soul, with might!

Praise the Lord

³Hear, O kings; give ear, O princes; to the Lord I will sing; I will make melody to the Lord, the God of Israel.

¹⁰Tell of it, you who ride on white donkeys, you who sit on rich carpets and you who walk by the way.

¹¹ To the sound of musicians at the watering places,

there they repeat the righteous triumphs of the Lord,

the righteous triumphs of his villagers in Israel.

³¹"So may all your enemies perish, O LORD! But your friends be like the sun as he rises in his might."

²⁴Most blessed of women be Jael, the wife of Heber the Kenite, of tent-dwelling women most blessed.

Sisera's Mother

-A sarcastic description of her waiting for Sisera to return with the spoil (28-30)

Jael: The Lord uses the weak and foolish to crush the enemy

Genesis 3: The serpent being crafty/shrewd, deceiving the woman Judges 4: Jael being crafty/shrewd, deceiving the enemy
